The briefing was in (somewhat belated) response to the commitment I gave at the last Full Council Meeting, in response to Cllr C's question, to provide a briefing that attempted to draw the strands together but not in any way compromise *tie*'s negotiating position. It's possible you were not in the Chamber at that time; but other councillors were certainly expecting it. It has been a bit of a nightmare pulling together the few facts that *tie*, legal, financial etc would actually allow to be committed to paper.

We heard about Cardownie's squeals about legal challenges a few hours ago from CorpComms. *tie*, as you will know, is in constant touch with the Information Commissioner. *tie*'s advice on what can/cannot be published is rooted in that interaction, as well as their own commercial/legal sensitivities surrounding the disputes.
