Er, this wasn't quite the response I was expecting! We asked if we could just 'tap' into their BIW for simplicity. Their subsequent proposal is that they set up, in effect, an area of BIW with all the stuff in – which the Colin Brady letter calls a new Project. The elegance of that is that they would only have to notify us of stuff without having to transmit the actual thing. Also, it would, at a stroke, comprise the contractually required "Technical Library" (Infraco contract page 227).

So what I was hoping you'd say was something like . . . "What a good idea! We (i.e. IT) support this and will facilitate the associated licence requirement/transfer".

Can u have a reconsider please?
