1	Meeting called following correspondence received by JD and Tom Buchanan from business representatives.	
	JD thanked the retailers for their support for the tram project.	
	Meeting provides an opportunity to assess the current position of the tram project and to hear the issues in full from key retailers	
	Not envisaged that any changes will be decided at the meeting but will allow officers to investigate options.	
	GBir - Businesses have been working in very difficult circumstances for over a year	
	Recognition that this is a crucial time for retailers with 30-40% of traders annual turnover of generated during the Christmas period	
	GD - Has received much correspondence from retailers over a wide range of issues to do with the tram project. Much frustration over frequent small changes to the project which are undertaken without informing retailers	
2	Project Communications There was agreement that project Communications are not of the standard and quality that should have been expected. This has led to a number of surprises for retailers.	
	JD - Communications failings are the subject of ongoing discussions	
	MA - There is a difference in understanding between the project's Private and Public sector stakeholders. Messages are not being conveyed appropriately.	
	GBir - current comms/marketing spend represents 0.001% of project budget - suggest the sum available should be re-examined	
	GD - Agreements reached at Tram Operations Group (TOG) meetings are not being adhered to or recognised by Tie. GD not being informed when major changes to the project are being made.

3 Christmas Embargo

Embargo is crucial for retailers, especially in the current economic climate. Will provide a short respite from the high degree of disruption associated with the project.

GBur - Willie Gallagher had offered a 5-week embargo across the City Centre with the caveat that there may be a request for the works to continue at Haymarket if they were very close to completion. MP agreed that this was his understanding.

MA - Wants a clear east-west route for shoppers through Haymarket to the car parks at the East End without major diversions. People must be able to drive into the city centre, park and shop. Had spoken to MP on the 7th Nov to stress the need for Shandwick Place to be opened up to traffic

GBur - There was an understanding that works would be back filled to open up access during the embargo period.

Haymarket Phase 1

DF - Haymarket Phase 1 comprises the area from the Haymarket Bar to Ryries

MA stated that one week's notice given of a major extension to the duration of the work and the start of Phase 2

JM - Suggestion that consent for the changes to the project timetable was granted by CEC Transport Service on 6th November but that the TOG meeting was told nothing of this

DF - Does not believe that a final decision had been taken on the extension of the works at this time but that discussions were ongoing

DF commented on the works at Haymarket:

- Road Safety Audit (published late October 08) has required slight changes to be made to the location of the tramlines at Haymarket.
- If tramworks were suspended then roadworks would have to remain for safety reasons.
- Changes to the temporary traffic management system currently in place would take several weeks to implement and would lead to considerable delays to the whole project
- Feeling is that the current Traffic Management System is working.

Haymarket Phase 2

DF - Manor Place scheduled to be closed from 29.11.08. Stated that this is Phase 2 and is separate from works at Haymarket.

MA - Start of Phase 2 is a clear violation of the embargo.

JD – Requested that DF feedback to Tie that they should suspend the implementation of Phase 2 until after the embargo period

NEC – Have the hours of work been looked into? Could working hours be increased to shorten the duration of the project?

GBur stated that, when there was a desire to get the works completed on Leith Walk for the start of Infraco, the area was prioritised and with extra resources being made available. Could the same be done at Haymarket?

4 Mitigation Measures

It was agreed that if the works cannot be suspended then efforts must be made to mitigate their impact

Possibility of opening up car parks at Murrayfield to create a park & ride facility up to and over the Christmas period. MP to talk to the SRU

	GD - Desire to bring start date forward to coincide with the city centre embargo	
	DF to investigate extending Leith Walk embargo with Tie	DF
7	George Street GD – Assurances were made that George Street would be 'put back as it was'. No mention was made of the turning circles which have been put in place and much	
	parking has been removed.	
	Why does George Street need to be altered now that buses have been returned to Princes Street? What chance of taking away the turning circles?	
	DF – Advice from traffic consultants that as many temporary restrictions have been removed from the area as possible whilst maintaining public safety.	
	DF - Access to Hanover Street will be allowed as long as it does not overload the junctions	
	JM – Wishes to see road network returned to its previous state DF - The previous road layout had safely failings and needed addressed regardless of the tramworks.	
	JD – Asked DF to feed back to Tie the request to restore George Street to its previous state but stressed that public safety in the city centre is paramount	DF
