

The chart below indicates the current status of the critical issues.
The significant improvement this week is, in my opinion, due to three things:
(1) A renewed focus on the need for progress.
(2) A decision that items at PD1 should be progressed to the Detailed Design phase despite not having been through the modelling or PD2 phase. This does of course introduce risk, but it is likely to be minimal overall, and in many cases sensibly zero as often no alternative physical design solutions are possible anyway.
(3) The right people being present at the meeting – please come again!
