Executive Summary

Construction works commenced this month, 9th July, along Ocean Drive, section 1A, 1 week later than programmed – presently 2 days behind programme. Conflicting utilities within the road crossings and consequential delays prime cause of initial delay. Subsequent sections 1B and 5A due to commence as per rev 05 programme dates, despite late issue of IFC drawings.

Trial holes along Leith Walk commenced 30th July, in advance of permanent works. Validation of ex service positions within critical locations. These works will continue in advance of main works at all key areas.

Works generally in line with rev 05 programme.

1.0 Safety

- There were no accidents reported this period.
 The accident frequency rate (AFR) remains 0.00.
- The AMIS MUDFA Accident Frequency Rate (AFR) remains at zero. There
 was a utility strike (street lighting) at Gogar Depot and an incident report has
 been completed and actions assigned.
- Four site inspections were undertaken in the period.
 Two inspections at utility diversion sites; Minor findings reported regarding personnel certification and training records, contractor site inspections, fuel storage and level of first aid kit provision.

 Two inspections at Gogarburn depot; No findings and reported as a well run, organised site.
- Three safety tours were completed. One serious finding reported regarding the lack of a site traffic management plan at Gogarburn Depot Advance Works.

2.0 Progress Period (End July)

2.1 Construction

- · Completed Trial Site at Casino Square.
- Commenced Section 1A/N (Tower Street to Rennie Isle Bridge).
- Commenced 9th July and running approximately 2 days behind schedule due to unforeseen services.

- Embargo dates being complied with and completion on time is anticipated. All
 road crossings completed by 31st July as planned. Constitution Street road
 crossing to be carried out in September following lifting of Embargo.
- CCTV Sewer Surveys 90% complete (Remaining surveys in hand).

2.2 Design

- During the period SDS has re-submitted the following sections of utility design work to the Statutory Utility Companies (SUC's). The Sections delivered are as follows:
 - Section 5A on 16 July 2007 (Confirmation of gas governor position)
 - Section 5B on 13th July 2007 (Identification of services below guided busway)
 - Section 5B on 24th July 2007 (C4 response drawings to BT Openreach)
 - Section 6 on 20th July 2007 (Re-routing of water services around Gogar Depot)
 - Commercial issue has delayed up the delivery of SGN only, for Section 1B. At this moment three different options for gas proposals in Section1B have been put forward for consideration. tie presently in discussion with SGN to conclude preferred option which will require approval by the Investment Approvals Committee. Drawings (one of the three options required work) will be issued for the MUDFA Work Order Pack for the Construction start date of 6th August 2007. SGN utilities will be highlighted to verify options still under consideration.
 - IFC drawings for section 1B received Friday 27/7 (pm), excluding SGN and SW. 1 week later than stated by SDS. SW IFC's due weds 1/8/07.
 IFC drawings for sections 5A and 6 remain outstanding. Both due to commence 20//8/07.
 - IFC drawing release remains a major concern to programme targets and continuity of workstream.

2.3 Traffic Management

- The Traffic Management Proposals were received, reviewed and approved for the initial Works Section on Leith Walk, between Croall Place and Pilrig Street. The TM proposals for this section of the works were approved on the 16th July. The MUDFA construction works on this site are programmed to commence on the 6th of August. And the works are anticipated for a period of approximately 2 months.
- The Traffic Management proposals for the first week of Trial Holes required on Leith Walk, to determine the location and depth of the existing services have been agreed by the Stakeholders. These works shall commence the week starting the 30th of July. 83 trial holes are programmed along the length of Leith Walk; these works shall be completed by the end of August 07.
- AMIS have been instructed to undertake trial holes at the junction between Princes Street / Hanover Street and The Mound on the weekend of the 28th and 29th of July. These works are required to determine the location and depth of existing services. The Traffic Management required to undertake these tasks has been agreed by the Tram Project Stakeholders. The working activities shall be undertaken between 0700 and 1200 to avoid traffic delays; no noise shall occur as a result of the site activities before 0800.

- The works ongoing on the CCTV surveys required throughout the length of the tramline are almost complete. The remaining works are to be undertaken in Constitution Street. These works are programmed for completion by the 5th of August. The survey team were unable to undertake the survey of broken Scottish Water manholes on McDonald Road and Princes Street. SW have been informed and AMIS await confirmation of the replacement of these cover to allow them to undertake the required works in these location.
- The works ongoing on the CCTV surveys required throughout the length of
 the tramline are almost complete. The remaining works are to be undertaken
 in Constitution Street. These works are programmed for completion by the 5th
 of August. The survey team were unable to undertake the survey of broken
 Scottish Water manholes on McDonald Road and Princes Street. SW have
 been informed and AMIS await confirmation of the replacement of these
 cover to allow them to undertake the required works in these location.

2.4 Communications & Stakeholder

- A media briefing was arranged for 24 July to give journalists comprehensive details about the project going forward. Willie Gallagher, Graeme Barclay, Andy Malkin and Mike Connelly gave presentations. Phil Douglas escorted press on a bus tour of the tram route to Haymarket. Again, this was covered extensively and programme details are now in the public domain.
- Coverage has been positive and fairly factual (inaccuracies have been corrected individually) and the pressure is now on to deliver as promised.
- Work at Gogar Depot continues with no coverage this month. Hoardings and signage are being agreed for the site.

Major activity is now in progress to communicate with the areas affected by the initial MUDFA works. The following customer packs have been issued:-

 During the first three weeks of July, a total of 38 contacts have come through the Trams for Edinburgh MUDFA helpline and these can be broken down into the following categories:

3.0 Commercial

 Proposals to resolve the shortcomings and omissions in the MUDFA Contract documentation has been agreed in principle and require to be reexecuted – the timing and co-ordination to be agreed with AMIS.

- Proposals for a negotiated commercial and contractual resolution to the delays in release of design are ongoing with AMIS.
- A proposal for incentivisation of the works orders and preliminaries has been discussed and agreed in principle with AMIS. A number of scenarios related to the incentivisation proposal are being discussed to define the process and ensure the parties are in agreement on the understanding and operation of the proposal – this process will be completed in period 4 with a view to have a formal legal agreement in place during period 5.
- Change orders and change notices are being issued to cater for contract additions (copy of master schedule attached).
- Weekly commercial meetings are taking place between tie and AMIS.
- A training session for tie site personnel on the use of the ARM risk software was held in the period, but additional 'hands on' training is required.
 A joint project risk meeting and management of the tie /AMIS MUDFA project risks was held in the period to establish and agree joint risk own.
 - A joint project risk meeting and management of the tie /AMIS MUDFA project risks was held in the period to establish and agree joint risk owners and mitigation plans. Subsequent meetings are planned to monitor and review risk process's.
- Construction commenced 9th July 2007. The delay of the commencement of the construction works to date and a full review of the delays and associated costs to date will be carried out in the next period in conjunction with the review of a revised programme, Rev 6.
- A significant issue has arisen regarding service connections for Scotland Gas Network (SGN) within existing premises which are outwith the LOD. This issue is currently subject to discussions with SGN and will be updated in the next period.

4.0 Operations Next Period

4.1 Construction

- Continuation of works in section 1A on Ocean Drive within verges and footpaths.
- Commencement of works in section 1B, MacDonald Road to Iona St.
- Continuation of trial holes down Leith Walk (opposite side)
- Commencement of works in section 5A, Russell road to Balgreen Road.
- Commencement of Gogar Phase II pending successful negotiations with AMIS.
- Completion of CCTV surveys on route.

 Refer to Appendix 1 for 3 month look-ahead for construction and design outputs.

4.2 Design

Refer to Appendix 2 for IFC drawings that are due for issue by the 31st August.

4.3 Programme

 Review of rev 05 required to reflect the design rescheduling for sections 1A – Victoria Bridge to Newhaven

Section 1B - Constitution Street outside LOD

Section 7 – Airport link-up for TRAM requirements only.

4.4 Commercial

- Finalise incentivised scheme within formal legal agreement.
- Assessment of potential overhead recovery claim (AMIS) to be completed for discussion.
- Review of financial impact following realignment of programme with SDS revised design deliverables.

5.0 Initiatives

- Review of service utility diversions requirements based on revised depth and protection. Area of review 600 - 1200 depth range below FRL. Potential 10% saving in measured works (approx. £1M).
- Co-location of SDS designer at MUDFA offices to initiate prompt response to technical issues/ queries – minimise time delay.
- Maximise recovery of costs associated with SUC C4 estimates via specialist consultant advice/input (Berkeleys/Corduroys).
- Provision of foam concrete in lieu of traditional backfill additional costs of concrete off set against time savings in labour, plant and programme overall.
- Establish 'quick response' team SDS, AMIS, tie and SUC for all technical queries to mitigate standing time on site.
- Provision of independent survey team to carry out dilapidation survey along Tram route (SDS responsibility) – protect tie's position from potential 3rd party claims post MUDFA and INFRACO.

6.0 Key Issues/Blockers

- Issue/release of Issued for Construction (IFC) drawings in line with programme requirements – programme and financial impact.
- Internal supply connections within premises outwith LOD (SGN) programme and financial impact.
- NR requirements working over Leith walk bridge contractor link up required.
 Potential facility within AMIS organisation.
- Design works outside LOD Constitution Street.
- Section 1A utility redesign following Tram realignment continuity of work in line with rev 05 programme.

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


Programme Summary, Route Map & Key






Programme MUDFA Programme Summary (Start Dates)
