Jason,

Slightly different from my understanding, so I have written to clarify some points

Going forward, your programme should be developed to demonstrate how you will achieve your milestones. I am happy for you to re-baseline as this will make the programme easier to follow, and encourage people to use the thing. However, tie is extremely eager to ensure that we track any historical slippage. To do this, you have agreed to provide a commentary, for ties' approval, so that we have a record of how we got to where we are.

Taking account of the charette changes, we cannot pre-empt the decision of the TEL board to proceed. Your analysis of each change must outline how you will programme the work, and advise of any impacts. Subsequently, until approved, the programme should reflect some form of parallel working, or as you say, to minimize abortive working. I think that this is a logistical nightmare, and it will only be resolved when we know if we are to proceed with the changes. You have my sympathy, but I don't think we have an option.

Willie,

Further to our meeting on Thursday 27 July with yourself, Dominic Stewart, John McAloon and David Ramsey I thought it worth confirming what was agreed as the way forward with the update of the SDS Project Design Plan.

Due to the recent changes driven by the Charette relating to issues principally associated with Section 1, it was agreed that SDS will produce a re-baselined design plan. This is to reflect the impact of the Charette changes on the critical path and in particular with respect to the junction modelling. SDS are to re prioritise the detailed design work to avoid abortive work on sections already identified for change as a result of the Charette.

SDS are also to include a new section on the plan to undertake the analysis of the route sections addressed during the Charette. These are as follows;

Haymarket Junction Shandwick Place Prince's Street St Andrew Square Piccardy Place Lieth Walk Foot of the Walk.

The programme will include a period of option development where the options presented in the Tram Charette 26/27 June - Outputs Report will be developed and reviewed to establish if they are technically feasible. During a meeting today with Gavin Murray it was agreed that this will be followed by a meeting with tie and CEC to present the findings of the review. If this is approved the option will be progressed to Preliminary design status at which point it will be submitted to tie and subsequently CEC for approval. Where the options are either technically unacceptable, or rejected during the go/no go meeting the original preliminary design will be progressed into detailed design.

The revised plan will be fully resourced and SDS will prepare a narrative to support the plan which will detail the changes in the plan and the impact on key dates. The re-baselined plan will be issued to tie on 11 August.
