You need to be aware that we are now incurring delay to the modeling programme.

JRC have been asked directly by tie to model the so-called 'alternative design' for Picady Place. This is likely to take at least a further week. SDS, of course, is designing up the Gyratory option.

We should now be well into the review of the Wider Area Impacts (subject to final contractual agreement with Tie) however Tie will not let JRC run the VISUM model until Picady Place is resolved by the Council once and for all.

The VISSIM model needs the outputs from VISUM to be able to move to the next step.
