There is a lot more to this than meets the eye. I am in discussion with David Crawley on the subject. In summary unfettered access to Hummingbird is not an option and nor should it be required. This is also to protect tie as there is a lot of commercially sensitive info on the system to which BBS shoult not have access.

We are working hard to provide design information as requested but I feel that BBS is clouding the issue with apparently reasonable requests which may be appropriate for a design build contract but are peripheral to the objective of price certainty for the Infraco contract under the circumstances envisaged by the business case. Price certainty here can be improved by focusing on design completion although perhaps the key focus now should be closer intertrogation of the BBS offer especially in light of the potential change to Employer Requirements
