
Please find attached a short note on a serious issue with the Edinburgh Trams Business case. Simplistically, the TEE results are incorrect and an attempt has been made to correct them. Whilst this is not precise, the result, with certainty, is a reduction in the reported BCRs. The best estimate is that the BCR for Phase 1a falls from 1.10 to 0.63 and for Phase 1a+1b from 1.63 to 1.16.
