Happy to talk you through the answers to your questions but in summary:

1. Staff outwith the tie VR policy

The individuals who had a negotiated package outwith the policy were Richard Jeffrey and Alastair Richards.

- 1.1 Vic Emery, the chairman of the tie board, negotiated an agreed severance package with Richard Jeffrey. I am not sure who was party to these discussions within CEC. He was paid his contractual notice plus an ex gratia sum.
- 1.2 Alastair Richards was an employee of Edinburgh Trams Limited (with tie Ltd as part of the TEL group). Following detailed internal and external legal advice, Alastair Richards was offered a termination package that comprised a voluntary redundancy package on the same terms as the tie employees together with an additional payment of £25k. Negotiations were initially by the Director of City Development and the chair of tie. I was brought in to give legal advice to minimise our exposure and conclude matters.

2. The Council decision

As you may recall, the final decision on the preferred option and funding for the tram project was taken on 2 September, when the decision of 25 August was reversed. A copy of the minutes is attached. There was a division on 2 September and on a roll call, the voting was as follows:-
