It was useful to have the discussion with you and Blair.

I have been minded about three things in my approach to Princes Street:

- 1. We had a choice of pursuing RTN first or Clause 37 the RTN route fitted in with the timetable Richard set us for termination.
- 2. Although I have heard it said that the Roads Authority hasn't approved the design for PSSA I have found it hard to promote that idea.
- 3. Any remediation plan would have to be approved by the Roads Authority which would in effect circumvent the status of the approval of the design for works carried out (on a cost plus basis) for PSSA.

I am now minded that we can refuse to accept the rectification plan at our absolute discretion and decide whether to use Clause 37.

I am minded that if we do – we should state that BSC should remove and replace work to a design Consented to by the Approval Bodies and in accordance with the Employer's Requirements. We should refer to Clause 36 and require a testing regime. We would also need to set a timetable including obtaining approvals.

As Blair says there are some other defects which we should also refer to.

Failure would entitle us to exercise Clause 37.2 and instruct others to carry out the work at BSC's cost.

We should reserve our rights under clause 90.

As I keep saying this needs careful thought.



Princes Street update 11.00 Thursday

We remain on track to reopen Princes Street at 05.00 Sunday morning.

This is despite a very difficult 24 hrs since my last report where the shocking weather significantly hampered progress on issues such as laying of the final road surfaces, white lining and mastic jointing, all of which are activities which cannot be carried out in severe weather. (it has been an exceptionally wet November which has not helped progress generally). The forecast for the next few days is much better and we have already caught up some of the lost time from yesterday and last night over the course of this morning. I would emphasis to you the one family approach that the consortium has fully embraced in order to complete this, all contractors carried on working through the night in this weather. They have also readily offered supportive press comment.

Despite the weather we did complete some traffic signals installation and testing as planned.

Today's priority is to catch up on the time lost yesterday, which, given the weather forecast we are confident we will be able to do. (there will be a lot of tar wagons in the city today)

We have identified one further area (the pavement at the south-west corner of The Mound/Princes Street Junction) which will be a temporary black-top finish rather than the final setts/slabs, which will be done at a later date. None of the work identified for later will require the closure of Princes Street.

'Sparkles' events gained access as planned and the fountains are now in place and working, and the snow-globe is also in place. As I send this Radio Forth are broadcasting live from Princes Street.
