
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Overview

- HSQE performance continues with AFR continuing to improve.
 Safety Strategy proposed and presented to Board.
- Infraco Engagement is not fully effective and specific disputed areas are being addressed as a major concern.
- Co-ordinated progress on Princes Street continues on programme for 21 February.
- Utilities CUS underperforming and necessitating further interventions. Integration opportunities and transfer of works to others being actioned actively.
- Programme recovery work progressing with better Infraco contribution.
- Cost/risk ranges presented by tie/CEC to Transport Scotland.

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- There was 1 minor injury; BSC subcon operative twisted ankle, but no reportable accidents during period 11. The AFR for the annual rolling period is now 0.26 which is above the target of 0.24.
- The 13 period frequency of service damage fell for period 11. There were no power cable strikes during this period.
- 4 incidents involving Members of the Public, were reported to tie via claims rather than contractor reporting. Action will be taken with CUS to improve reporting and investigation.
- 100% of planned H&S tours and inspections were achieved in period 11, however, only 1 formal PM inspection had been completed in MUDFA by week 4 of period 11. This is being addressed.
- The number of near misses/unsafe conditions reported has increased to 22 (almost 40%) for MUDFA in the last period. Near miss reporting is encouraged and recent re-briefings may have driven the number of reports however, Carillion only reported 7 during period 11.
- A joint Health and Safety workshop was held between tie, BSC and Transdev. The 60 strong audience listened to a number of presentations, participate in a climate survey and contributed to a workshop session discussing the main HSQE risks to the Tram Project.

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Project Delivery Princes Street

- · Enabling works on programme, Mackenzie's performing well
- Traffic/pedestrian management Plans approved by TMRP.
 Additional pedestrian modelling underway.
- Logistics –logistics contract awarded and start-up meeting held, delivery route maps out to retailers/hauliers this week.
- Emergency plan –completed. Reflects requirements of emergency services and CEC.
- · Traffic contingency plan completed.
- Fencing banner wrap in design, supplier on board and final details on fire standards being completed.
- Implementation plan in production with resource plan for implementation weekend.
- · Risks SU's doing other works on George St, weather

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Project Delivery Utilities Works

- · Overall 67% complete progress poor
- Edinburgh Airport work cannot be undertaken by Carillion because of failure to agree Collateral Warranty with EAL.
- · Alternative routes to deliver being implemented.
- Further elements of scope may be transferred to BSC if there are advantages in cost/programme and confidence in BSC delivery.
- BT works now commencing.
- Integrated programme for Haymarket, Ocean Terminal, Leith Walk expected this week.
- Quality of CUS resource escalated with CUS Managing Director.

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Project Delivery Infraco Progress

- Disappointing ongoing issues with:
 - Delayed appointment and mobilisation of package/sub contractors
 - Design slippage and design changes (including instructions)
 - Incomplete/ delayed utilities diversions.
 - Submission of Estimate and agreement of change orders (Holding work)
 - Consortium integrated programme

Works progressing well on;

- Princes St works and associated planning, enabling, and subcontractor engagement.
- Tram vehicle works
- Progress impeded by potential dispute.

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Project Delivery Infraco Issues Resolution

- There is a significant risk of a major dispute with Infraco. This is drawn by the following issues:
 - BSC's refusal to progress works which may be affected by a change which has not been subject to issue of an agreed tie Change Order .
 - BSC's failure to provide timely and/or competent Estimates to allow a change to be assessed and if appropriate a Change Order agreed and issued.
 - Specific areas of disagreement e.g. responsibility for changes in design from Base Date Design Information (BDDI) to Issued for Construction (IFC) drawing.
- Absence of any approach to resolving these issues acceptable to BSC constitutes plus other mobilisation issues represent multiple breaches of contract.
- Preparations underway to commence formal Dispute Resolution based upon legal advice.

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InfraCo Issues (2)

Options

- A. Agree a workable solution (e.g. Section by Section release) after raising visibility within top level consortium.
- B. Targeted DRP to unlock pressure point(s).
- C. Significant dispute major impact on Works progress and costs.

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Project Delivery Other Issues

For noting;

- · TROs expect formal consultation in May/June
- Haymarket Car Park compensation NR agreed; First ScotRail element re: franchise extension still being pursed with Transport Scotland. TS initial response was to reject.
- Fastlink (Guided Busway) wide area measures and associated TRO underway and on programme currently.
- Murrayfield pitch works complete. Lighting variations being completed.

Costs Review - Update from Jan TPB

- No change in range of outturn for Phase 1a £522m to £540m.
 Same principal assumptions:
 - No future disruption due to unforeseen traffic management
 - No future design changes not separately funded
 - The Infraco will commence construction on Princes Street and the Depot as programmed in Jan/Feb 09
 - Commercial engagement with Infraco and delivery impetus improves significantly and leads to a revised programme with service commencement date +/- July 2011
- Commercial engagement with Infraco and progress with works remains the major uncertainty – additional risk allowances for time and design changes are key variables
- Report to March TPB on progress in mitigating costs increases / securing opportunities in all areas.

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Change Control

- Update on status for P11 evaluated.
- During the period £3.9m was drawn down from risk and contingency all of which has been approved in line with the delegated authority and the project change panel.

 - Gogar Interchange
 - Additional Embargo imposed in Leith Walk and Constitution St
 - Princes St additional resources to keep city moving etc
 - Manor PI consequence of delays implementation of closure of utilities
