Gavin,

The Transdev Response to this document is as follows:

- The document purpose is unclear in the overall suite of documents.
- Clearly SDS could use as a contractual vehicle in the future; care is therefore needed in what is included.
- The document is fundamentally flawed in that the degree of detail is so variable between disciplines. Detail consistent with that under 8 Tramstops would be a good start.
- The single iteration referred to under 1 General (last para) is key to programme assumptions. Is this in line with **tie**'s programme assumption?
- There is nothing on the approach to key interfaces.
- There is no clarity on the relative assumed scope of design between SDS and Infraco. This could be considered not relevant to the document as presented, but we feel is important for **tie** and us all to be clear. This is of course most relevant to the E&M elements, where it is vital to understand the respective scopes of work against the procurement background.
- The following elements of the works do not appear to be covered (list not intended to be complete):
  - Structures in general (degree of detailed design)
  - Ductwork
  - Environmental (Fauna management, noise, vibration etc)
  - Earthworks
  - Trackforms; Permanent Way (inc. P&C control etc)
  - Depot equipment and tools
  - OLE layouts and componentry
  - Traction power
  - o LV power
  - o Traffic signalling
  - SCC generally
  - Landscaping (Hard, soft)

Overall we feel the document as presented is not useful.
