As we discussed earlier this week I am working on a paper which will focus on the sign off requirements. I also met with Duncan Fraser this morning on schedule 13 issues and design issues. As part of that discussion we briefly discussed the Council's aspirations re sign off.

In essence the Council has not seen very much in relation to Infraco (not that there's much to see!). That said they have people on stand-by to review and based on the current programme they are assuming that they will receive documentation very shortly to review. I tried to manage their expectations and hinted that the ItN for Infraco is more likely to be released towards the end of the summer. In the meantime I agreed that we would forward to them copies of the specifications for review. Hopefully this is okay. I know that John Lyall made various comments on the specs and I'm not sure if these have now been addressed. Even if these haven't been dealt with I don't think there is any harm in forwarding the latests drafts to the Council. No doubt you will have your own thoughts on this.

The Council would also welcome weekly sessions as the drafting progresses on the key documents/clauses in the contract. We spoke about this previously and I think the idea was to have sessions with CEC, TEL and TS on key issues like pay mech as matters progressed. Is this still your intention? This would be in addition to any red team review.

Finally we discussed sign off. The 6 week rule still applies for the approval of the contract awards. Duncan seemed to think that before Infraco or Tramco ItN could be released, it would need to go to full council. This was the first I had heard of this and I asked Duncan to speak to Andrew Holmes to clarify. I stressed that full council approval may not be necessary since what was being released was an ItN and not a contract. I indicated that they may need to compromise re sign off timescales. As a minimum they would require a pre contract summary report similar to the one which was done for Tramco. I will chase Duncan next week in this regard.

1 will complete my paper which will be my thoughts on now the documents at an stages should be signed on.
