At the progress meeting on Tuesday, it became apparent that they are hiding behind the critical issues - eg SRU - the alignment will not change so despite the moving of the pitches still requiring resolution, the tram alignment and design can and should be continuing.

Similarly with the RBS tramstop, SDS could be designing a standard stop at this stage which will be varied once we have RBS design - given that RBS are paying for the design and construction costs then this would seem to be the right way to resolve this one.

There may be others where creative solutions can be found to allow progress to be made.
