You have just told me at the PD review that you have a 90% confidence of ~£1m and 50% confidence of £1.8m with regard to substantiated tie deductions. We discussed it at length and you and John were very clear. I can see two options. Either you stand by that assessment and increase the tie deduction from CUS in the certificate or you explain to me why the 90% confidence number stated on Tuesday is now no longer reliable.

Not providing for anything more than the current ± 300 k deduction is not credible whilst still trying to argue that there is an extremely high likelihood of > ± 1 m.

Steven, no issue with provision of briefing note and also a narrative for each of the key items. However, as I mentioned at the PD review, there is significant review required for the correspondence associated with each event and that is why we stated we needed the 3 weeks all toll to compile all the supporting documentation. I am currently going through all the correspondence to align with all the items alone and do not see conclusion of this exercise before the end of next week earliest (using Kirsty 2-3 days/week).

We have taken no cognizance of these events within our assessment of CUS evaluations to date, excluding a deduction of £299,188 - £180.5K (insurance events), 10K (B0 materials), £29K(supply of BTO ducts), £79.7K(Gogar depot (800 watermain)). This value has remain static and has been included within tie assessment over the last 5

months. Moreover, we issued the list of all potential tie deductions (known at that point in time, but not fully valued) to Carillion 9/12/09 - valued at approximately £2.995M (sent to Steve Beattie and Phil Kolon). Appreciate the importance of the matter, but do not wish to give false expectations.
