I was on site at Haymarket on Saturday and had a look at the cellar. Unfortunately, Mark is quite correct, the cellar wall at the location inspected is suffering from years of water damage exacerbated by a lead water service which has been roughly broken through. There is no doubt that it is dangerous at this location. Apparently the cellar gave way when one of our operatives stood on it, his leg went straight through!

This will impact on the tram installation works given the proximity of the cellars to the track slab.

I recommend that we ask a Structural Engineer for an opinion and a design to effect a temporary repair and you may wish to speak to Frank McFadden agree a permanent solution.

I will speak to you about this on Monday.
