10 Notices of Motion for Debate at Council

10.1 By Councillor Dawe – Fox Covert Primary Schools Football Team – Scottish Cup Winners

"Council congratulates Fox Covert Primary Schools football team on winning the Scottish Cup, competed for by over 650 schools. Council thanks the Lord Provost for his decision to host a reception to recognise and celebrate this national success."

10.2 By Councillor Ewan Aitken - Duddingston Village - Traffic

"Council notes:

- the considerable traffic issues in Duddingston Village caused by the use of Old Church Lane and the low road through Holyrood Park as a de facto arterial route for the city;
- the fact that this route is totally unsuited to play this role in the Edinburgh traffic network;
- · that discussions on these issues go back over 20 years;
- the recent series of meetings between Historic Scotland, Police, City Development and Services for Communities to try and devise a way forward;
- recent discussion at the Craigentinny/Duddingston Neighbourhood Partnership and its Environmental Subgroup on the issues;
- that Council officers had been able to make some small adjustments through, for example, signage and road adaptation but have not had the authority to make significant strategic input into the discussions;
- that all these discussions have concluded that this issue needs to be set in the context of a wider, strategic discussion on arterial routes in the city.

Council agrees:

- to call for a report on the consequences of changing Old Church Lane and the Holyrood Park low road from a de facto arterial route into the city;
- that this report needs direct input from Director level in the relevant departments in partnership with the Police and Historic Scotland. This input should involve residents meeting with the relevant directors."

10.3 By Councillor Hinds – Aung San Suu Kyi – 65th Birthday

"Council notes the 65th birthday of Aung San Suu Kyi on 19 June 2010.

Council further notes that it is five years since the City of Edinburgh Council awarded her Freedom of the City.

Council deplores the injustice and inhumanity of her treatment and the suppression of her democratic right to freedom of assembly and expression of thought.

Therefore Council agrees that:

- The Lord Provost will send birthday greetings from the City of Edinburgh to Aung San Suu Kyi;
- The Lord Provost/Leader of the Council will contact the new Foreign Secretary to ensure the continued support of the British government in working for her release."

"Council congratulates Currie Rugby Club on completing their best ever season in the Club's short history, with the senior side winning the National League Championship, Under 15s and Colts winning National Cup competitions, the 2nd XV winning promotion and the 3rd XV winning their league.
