Here are my comments on Section 6 which I have visited with input from litigation colleagues.

My main observation would be is that I am not sure that Section A in Section 6 adds a great deal with its current length and could be omitted altogether without detracting from the Report.

Section B is critical since no matter what their corporate behaviour and overall mission may, it is their demonstrated approach to their contractual obligations under the Infraco Contract which speaks loudest in assessing Options.

As I said this afternoon, I consider that the final part of Section 6 adds appreciably to an understanding of why BB may be entrenched, why tie had to adopted DRP and why, comprehending BB's operational objectives, tie has confronted an absolute low watermark in the contractual relationship with BSC.

Will be interseted to hear Brandon's reflections and happy to discuss further.
