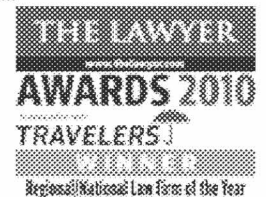

I spoke to Hazel Moffat and she said she had been approached "off the record" from a colleague at Pinsent Masons who was seeking Hazel's views as to whether **tie** was serious about entering mediation as Bilfinger Berger in Germany are very keen to enter into mediation with a view to bringing the current relationship to an end. Their motivation is that they are concerned that this project is taking up too much management time and is damaging their prospects on other jobs for which they are bidding and have the potential to have a negative impact on their share price.

Completely independently, Hazel has also been approached by John Campbell QC who says that he has been in conversation with BB and that they are desperately keen to enter mediation and were concerned that **tie** seemed less keen. John was phoning Hazel to seek to understand what appetite existed for mediation with **tie**.
