

1. Executive Summary

Alfred McAlpine Infrastructure Services (AMIS) has concluded the MUDFA Construction Services (CS) works at Casino Square (i.e. Trial Site) within the reporting period. The main focus since has been on the follow on works constituting the RAT 1A/1 Rev 1/2 proposals created and submitted by AMIS MUDFA, and this is currently delayed due to the elections and appointment of the new administration.

The main AMIS MUDFA concern still relates to the lack of availability of Issued for Construction (IFC) detailed design drawings complete with Bill of Materials (BOM's) and cost estimates by the SDS Provider (See Section 3 for specific details and status @ Rev 05).

In the next reporting period AMIS MUDFA will review the **tie** Limited commercial agreement and will take time out to evaluate the current position and create an alternate approach given the criticality and direct dependencies on the imminent INFRACO works (i.e major capital expenditure programme).






